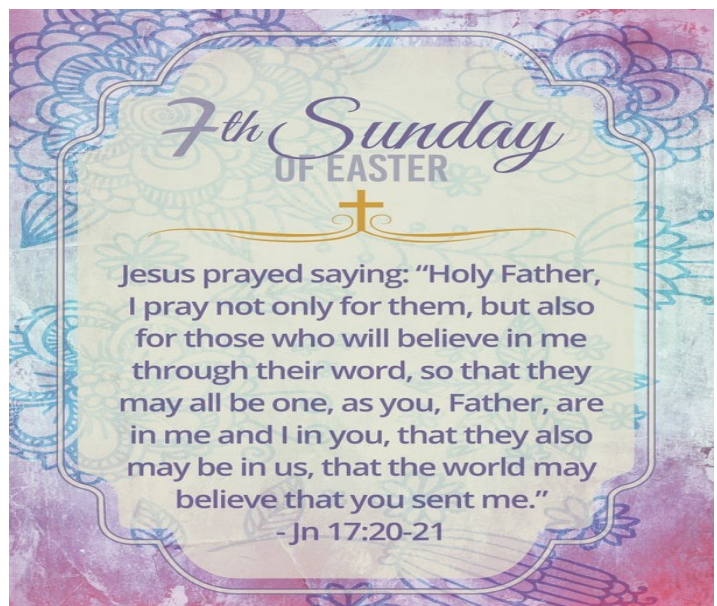

La Ascensión del Señor

Cuarenta días después de la gloriosa resurrección de Jesús, nuestro Señor ascendió al cielo (Hechos 1: 6-11). El *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica* (párrafo 665) dice: “La Ascensión de Cristo marca la entrada definitiva de la humanidad de Jesús en el dominio celestial de Dios, de donde vendrá de nuevo (cf. Hch 1,11); esta

humanidad, mientras tanto, lo esconde de los ojos de los hombres (cf. Col 3, 3)”. Antes de ascender en presencia de sus apóstoles, los comisiono para continuar su ministerios de redención, diciendo:

Jesus, se acercó y les dijo: “Se me ha dado toda autoridad en el cielo y en la tierra. Id, pues, y haced discípulos de todas las naciones, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo, enseñándoles a guardar todo lo que os he mandado; y he aquí, yo estaré con vosotros siempre, hasta el fin de los tiempos”. (Mateo 28: 18-20)

En Hechos 1: 1-11, San Lucas nos cuenta la historia de la Ascensión de Jesús al Cielo:

El primer libro lo dedique, Teófilo, a todo lo que Jesús hizo y enseñó después del principio hasta el día en que, después de haber dado instrucciones por medio del Espíritu Santo a los apóstoles que había elegido, fue levantado a lo alto. A estos mismos, después de su pasión, se les presento dándoles pruebas de que vivía, dejándose ver de ellos durante cuarenta días y hablándoles del Reino de Dios. Mientras estaba comiendo con ellos, les ordenó: No os vayáis de Jerusalén, sino aguardad la Promesa del Padre que oíste de mí. Porque Juan bautizó con agua, pero vosotros seréis bautizados con Espíritu Santo dentro de pocos días. Ellos, en cambio, habiéndose reunido, le preguntaron: Señor, ¿es en este momento cuando le vas a restablecer el Reino a Israel? Él les contestó: No es cosa vuestra conocer el tiempo y el momento que el Padre ha fijado con su propia autoridad; al contrario, vosotros recibiréis una fuerza, cuando el Espíritu Santo venga sobre vosotros, y de este modo seréis mis testigos en Jerusalén, en toda Judea y Samaria, y hasta los confines de la tierra. Y dicho esto, fue levantado en presencia de ellos, y una nube le ocultó a sus ojos. Como ellos estuvieran mirando fijamente al cielo mientras Él se iba, se les presentaron de pronto dos hombres vestidos de blanco que les dijeron Galileos, ¿por qué permanecéis mirando al cielo? Este Jesús, que de entre vosotros ha sido llevado al cielo, volverá así tal como le habéis visto marchar al cielo.

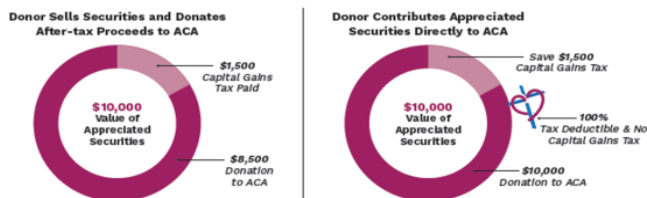
